### Fun Facts and Ideas

Did you ever wonder why “pure gold” equates to 24 karats? In ancient history, both gold and gems were weighed against the fairly uniform seeds of the carob fruit, a common tree throughout the Mediterranean and Near East. The words karat and carat both come from Latin and Arabic names for the fruit. (In the UK and other parts of the world, metal karats are spelled with a c, just like gem carats.) Standardized early Roman pure gold coins weighed 24 karats (or 24 carob fruit

seeds), and thus alloyed gold coins would be referred to as parts-relative-to-standard-gold-coin pure. 14K contains 14 parts pure gold and 10 parts alloy. If you divide 14 by 24 (pure gold 99.9%), you get approximately 58.5%, which is the 585 stamping sometimes seen indicating 14K. Many European manufacturers will stamp their pieces with the percentage; the best example is Italy at “750” for 18K ( $18/24 = .75$ ).

#### Great Resetting Idea

Have some different size diamonds that have no home? Consider setting them in bezels in a station necklace. Often called “diamonds by the yard” this is a piece of jewelry that can be worn every day for any event. And want to create multiple pieces for family members? It’s the perfect choice for any style. And you can also do birthstones for the perfect Mother’s necklace! So gather your bling!

### From sketch to bling

Sometimes when designing a new piece of jewelry, we can imagine what we think it will look like. But sometimes, it turns out way better than what we see in our brains! This client brought in multiple pieces of jewelry, loved the vintage design and requested adding emeralds. Combining a few ideas, creating pencil sketches, CADs then the wax, this gorgeous ring was born. We were able to use all her 36 diamonds adding only 1 more for balance. And yes we had fun! Pictures show rough pencil sketches, CAD, wax and final product, shown from different angles. This beauty will last for generations of bling lovers!



### What gemstone is that??


Often, when asked what the November birthstone is, some clients twitch

when shown the yellow/orange color of citrine, the most commonly used. As I have November child, I would like to introduce you to the Madeira citrine, pictured below. This deep burnt orange color is rich and warm, with little yellow.

Many birth months have different gemstones and many gemstones come in a variety of colors, like garnet and sapphire. So if you're looking for a unique gemstone, stop in. Colored gemstones are intriguing, unique and offer many options! We've created colored gemstones as centers to engagement rings, with sapphire being the most popular choice due to its hardness.

Any guess what the natural gemstone in the photo below is? Genuine spinel comes in a variety of colors, including red, blue, yellow, orange and violet, with red the most valuable and often mistaken as a ruby.

Two surprises occurred in the late 1700's when a mineralogist identified the Black Prince's Ruby and the Timur Ruby, part of the British crown jewels, as natural red spinel. Apparently, they didn't change the names, though.



### Color Grading of Diamonds

The below picture from a GIA is an illustration of how diamonds are color graded. The color or tones in a diamond are most visible upside down or on the side, as shown here. As you can see the tones of yellow increase as the color scale descends. You are looking for tones of yellow, brown or gray, indicating the different elements that were in the growth environment of the diamond crystal.



### New Bling Bracelets

Take a look at the newest in versatile jewelry; the Flex Bangle. Titanium wire forms the core with either 14K white or yellow gold as the outer portion. With natural diamonds, this is the perfect gift to wear alone or stack as it can be worn for a night out or with jeans.
